Objectives:

- 1. To share and brainstorm the perspective of schools, special organizations, policy makers, special educators of inclusive education,
- 2. To discuss and share the strategies of implementing inclusiveness in the teaching styles,
- 3. To share the results of the FGD with the policy makers and the key stakeholders,
- 4. To go a step forward in implementing inclusive education by discussing the various perspectives,
- 5. To provide a platform for the beneficiaries of the education system to share their challenges and concerns of inclusive education,
- 6. To develop and disseminate improved educational techniques and practices in schools,
- 7. To prepare and publish the results of the FGD,
- 8. To provide academic assistance and guidance to mainstream primary schools to implement inclusive education.

The event aimed to provide these opportunities to schools sharing their innovative ideas of inclusive education for social transformation. To find solutions to problem, identifications, to investigate different group ideas in group discussion.

Methodology:

The focus group discussion methodology was used to gain deeper understanding of the cooperation mechanisms of different institutions, schools, and of their capacities to provide support to children with disabilities.

Outcomes of the discussion:

Indicators of an inclusive school campus were created. The indicators discussed by both the groups are asunder:

- A physically and culturally inclusive school- infrastructure and way of thinking of the teachers and students will be different
- Special schools roles will be that of mentoring and facilitate inclusion- academically and therapeutically
- Teacher training every educator a special educator
- Parents and students will be sensitive to the issue of inclusion
- Accesses and concessions will be provided in every school
- Community awareness regarding academic and social inclusion to be high
- All experts in various fields to form a network of support for these schools.







Dr Homiyar and Benetech offer the following:

- Re-production of inaccessible content
- Training of publishers for creating 'Born Accessible' content
- Conducting Awareness workshops for both teachers and students for use of Assistive technology
- Short and medium term training modules for training students in the use of modern assistive technology
- Technological expertise to convert traditional schools for the blind to include modern technology as their teaching methodology.

To start this movement of inclusive schools, four schools in Ahmedabad have pledged to be the pioneers of inclusive education- The Riverside School, Podar International, Anand Niketan, and Rachna/Sharda School. Consortium will follow up for conducting Accessibility Audits for these institutions.

Action points:

- 1. The Blind People's Association (BPA) will collaborate for sensitizing in schools— for teachers and children. They will be able to help for curriculum adaptation and infrastructure designing and consultation
- 2. The B.M Institute of Mental Health (BM) can provide workshops for overall school behavior to be able to reach out to people for mental well-being. They can also help with audits. The Brotherhood is an organization that has already designed the indicators and it is a good place for refer
- 3. Benetech will provide doable minor changes to make the content program accessible for different needs
- 4. Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA) will provide awareness for resource center in schools
- 5. UNICEF will bring the right people at state level and expertise with schools to come together to look at creating state level resource room
- 6. Deepak Foundation will be responsible for creating an exhaustive list categorized under disabilities and services, and will turn it into an application so that it is accessible to all parents/teachers/NGO etc across the country
- 7. Anoora will provide customized curriculum for Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) and Autism. They will also provide parent awareness for therapies and environment for students with above disabilities
- 8. Sharda Trust would want to open the space for need analysis and teacher training
- 9. Leadership training in schools on inclusion to be made mandatory.
